## BACKGROUND & EXPERIENCE

During my undergraduate years at Hutchinson Community College, I served as President of the Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society, Vice President of Service for the Honors Program, and Captain of the Dragon Dolls Dance Team. As a President of Phi Theta Kappa, I ran our monthly executive team meetings, led initiation of new members, developed ideas for events, and executed such events. While serving as Vice President of Service for the Honors Program, I surveyed my colleagues to understand the type of community service projects they were interested in. These events included park clean up, volunteering with Big Brothers Big Sisters, and leading the way on our Tree Campus USA yearly ceremonies. As Captain of the Dragon Dolls Dance Team, I led warmups daily, choreographed around ten routines, handled daily 4:30am wakeup calls to ensure punctuality at our early morning practice, and helped my team members quickly learn and polish choreography. These experiences will serve me well as President-Elect because they taught me perseverance, grit, and the ability to put the needs of my team first.

Since starting pharmacy school, I have been an engaged participant in many organizations.
